

SALESIAN REFLECTION

3rd Sunday in Lent (3/12/2023)

Lent is a time for us to encounter Jesus in a very personal way so that we deepen our baptismal consecration and commitment. John tells us that he wrote about the encounter of Jesus with the Samaritan woman so that we "may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through this belief we may have life in his name."

Notice that, during this encounter, Jesus is drawing the woman beyond earthly realities and concerns to the deeper realities of the eternal. Jesus offers her "living water." He means water that gives life, but her attention is on earthly water. She asks him, rather sarcastically, if he thinks he's better than Jacob who gave them this well. Jesus refuses to be side-tracked from his goal - to give her water that will permanently end her thirst. All she can see is the convenience of not having to come to the well every day.

Jesus moves her to a new level by getting her to face the truth of her present situation. But he doesn't tell her to "come back when you've straightened out your life." The grace he offers is meant to help her to change – here and now.

Rather than make a commitment now, she says that she's waiting for the Messiah to come. Now, Jesus can offer her the opportunity for a personal commitment: "I am he."

The purpose of the story is to remind us that even committed disciples need to be brought to deeper understanding and conversion.

How great is our thirst during this Lenten season? What is the "food" we are seeking? What is it that Jesus wants us to understand through our Lenten encounters with him? St. Paul reminds us that God has proven his love for us. While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Our Lenten journey will be more fruitful if we are sincerely open when we encounter Jesus and are willing to be led by grace into a deeper conversion of mind and heart to the ways of the Lord. Then our hope will be based on the love of God poured out into our hearts.

THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE

WHAT?

The way we embrace Christ's call to conversion.

The step we take to express true repentance for our offenses.

The confession of our sins.

The reception of God's pardon and peace.

The **restoration** of our relationship with God and with the Church.

After Jesus declared that
Peter would be the rock
upon which he would build
his Church, he said to Peter,
"I will give you the keys to the
kingdom of heaven.
Whatever you bind on earth
shall be bound in heaven;
and whatever you loose on earth
shall be loosed in heaven."
(Mt 16:13-20)



After his resurrection,
Jesus appeared to his disciples,
extended his peace,
breathed the holy Spirit on them,
and sent them out saying,
"Whose sins you forgive
are forgiven them,
and whose sins you retain
are retained."
(Jn 20:19-23)

WHY?

We were born with the effects of **original sin**: disobedience toward God and a lack of trust in his goodness (Gen 3:1-11).

God the Father sent his Son, **Jesus Christ**, to save us from our sins (Jn 3:16).

Jesus accomplished his saving mission by establishing the **Kingdom of God** and by suffering, dying on the cross, rising from the dead, and ascending into heaven (Mt 5:17).

Jesus established the **Church** to continue his saving mission by the power of the Holy Spirit through the celebration of the sacraments (Mk 1:15, Jn 19:34, Acts 2: 1-4, 2 Cor 5:18).

Through faith in the Gospel and Baptism, we are first washed clean of all sin (Acts 2:38).

Through the **Sacrament of Penance**, we continue to experience the forgiveness of our sins (Mt 16:13-20, Jn 20:19-23).

How?

THE ORDER OF PENANCE

The Church celebrates the Sacrament of Penance using the *Order of Penance*.

The revised rites and formulas of the *Order of Penance* of the Second Vatican Council were promulgated in 1973.

A new translation was provided in 2023.

Celebrating the Sacrament of Penance or "going to confession" is a liturgical action that consists of:

- 1. The Reception of the Penitent
- 2. The Reading of the Word of God (Optional)
- 3. The Confession of Sins and The Acceptance of Satisfaction
- 4. The Prayer of the Penitent and The Absolution
- The Proclamation of Praise of God and The Dismissal of the Penitent

THE ACTS OF THE PENITENT

- 1. Contrition (sorrow for sin)
- Confession (inward examination, outward accusation)
- 3. Satisfaction (an act of penance)

"Penance requires . . . the sinner to endure all things willingly, be contrite of heart, confess with the lips, and practice complete humility and fruitful satisfaction."

(Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1450)



Going to Confession in Twelve Easy Steps

- 1. Examine your conscience, call to mind your sins, and then enter the confessional.
- 2. The priest will welcome and receive you.
- 3. Make the sign of the cross and say: "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."
- 4. The priest will invite you to trust in God. He may also read a text of Sacred Scripture.
- 5. Say these or similar words:
- "Bless me Father for I have sinned. It has been ____long since my last confession. These are my sins..."
- 6. Tell the priest your sins. Then say these or similar words: "For these and all of my sins, I am sorry."
- 7. Accept your work of penance (prayers, act of kindness, etc.) to help make satisfaction and amend your life.
- 8. Express your sorrow for your sins (Act of Contrition) in these or similar words:

"O my God, I am sorry and repent with all my heart for all the wrong I have done and for the good I have failed to do,

because by sinning I have offended you,

who are all good and worthy to be loved above all things.

I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid the occasions of sin.

Through the merits of the Passion of our Savior Jesus Christ, Lord, have mercy."

- 9. Receive God's forgiveness as the priest prays the Prayer of Absolution.
- 10. At the end of the Prayer of Absolution, reply: "Amen."
- 11. Give praise to God. When the priest says: "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good," conclude: "For his mercy endures forever."
- 12. Go in peace and remember to say or do your penance.



Cremation and Proper Handling of Cremated Remains Your Choices Don't Stop with Cremation

While you may have chosen to be cremated, remember to choose your final resting place. Although the Church earnestly recommends the pious custom of burying the bodies of the dead be observed, it does not however, forbid cremation unless it has been chosen for reasons which are contrary to Christian teaching. Cremated remains are the body of the deceased in a changed form. We should honor them as we honor the body. They must be reverently buried or entombed in a place reserved for the burial of the dead.


