SALESIAN REFLECTION

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time (2/5/2023)

St. Paul reminds us that our faith rests on the Cross of Christ and the convincing power of the Spirit, not on the wise argumentation of the world that so often leads to conflict and division. The crucified Jesus is the powerful manifestation of God's love that unifies.

In the Gospel, Jesus calls us to be what we are because of the power of the Spirit. You and I are *"the salt of the earth."* We flavor the world with the presence of God's loving concern. Jesus encourages us to look at the flavoring we are at present. If we are not flavoring the world around us with the presence of God's loving concern by the way we live each day, then we must be careful. Then we are good for nothing except to be thrown out and trampled.

You and I are *"the light of the world."* We are a *"city set on a hill,"* *"a lamp set on a stand to give light to all in the house."* Everyone sees us. Are we light in the darkness? The power of the Spirit working in us and through us is meant to touch others' lives with God's loving concern and mercy.

The theme of "light" appears again and again during this time before Lent. As Jesus manifested the light of God's great concern for the poor of this world, you and I are to be continuing manifestations of that care and concern.

When we are aware of God's presence in our own lives, then we are capable of illuminating the lives of others. When we do this is a way that makes it clear that we are reflecting the "true" light, then those around us will recognize the "light" we manifest and give thanks to the Father for it.

Francis de Sales must have had this in mind when he wrote: *"Let us be what we are, and let us be*

May today's Word be good news once again and may we rededicate ourselves to being flavorful "salt" and transparent "light" for our little corners of the world.

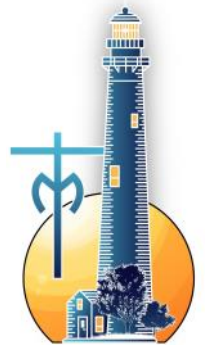

Happy Anniversary

It was 145 years ago, in January of 1878, that the Roman Catholic parish in the city of Cape May received a Certificate of Incorporation from the state of New Jersey and officially became Our Lady Star of the Sea Church.

The Certificate of Incorporation was witnessed by Bishop Michael Augustine Corrigan, Bishop of the Diocese of Newark, as well as Father Theophilus Degen, first pastor of Our Lady Star of the Sea Church, formerly known as St. Mary's Church, and two lay trustees of the parish, Francis J. Green and John Maguire.

The year, 2023, also marks other significant anniversaries in our parish history.

- The 175th Anniversary of St. Mary's Church, the first Catholic Church in Cape May County. (1848)
- The 150th Anniversary of St. Mary's Church becoming an independent parish with Father Theophilus Degen being named the first pastor. (1873)
- The 140th Anniversary of the establishment of St. Agnes Church in Sea Grove now known as Cape May Point. (1883)

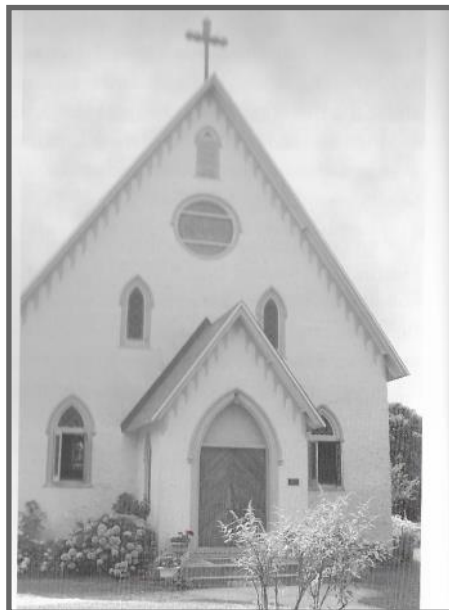
During the next few months, I will be sharing stories from our early history as a parish. (I am still that high school history teacher at heart.)

Most of the information will be taken from the wonderful anniversary books published in 1978 and 2003 to mark the 100th and 125th anniversaries of the 1878 incorporation of Our Lady Star of the Sea Church.

In 2028 we will celebrate the 150th anniversary of that event and the establishment of Our Lady Star of the Sea.

May we never forget that we have been blessed by the faith, service, and charity of the clergy, religious and parishioners who have preceded us.

While you may have chosen to be cremated, remember to choose your final resting place. Although the Church earnestly recommends the pious custom of burying the bodies of the dead be observed, it does not however, forbid cremation unless it has been chosen for reasons which are contrary to Christian teaching. Cremated remains are the body of the deceased in a changed form. We should honor them as we honor the body. They must be reverently buried or entombed in a place reserved for the burial of the dead.

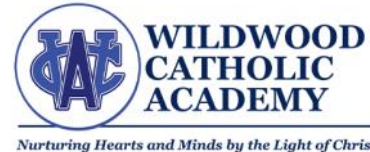
