

"I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my sheep, and mine know me."

SALESIAN REFLECTION

4th Sunday of Easter (4/30/2023)

Today's Gospel reading speaks of Jesus as the shepherd who calls his sheep by name and leads them out to pasture. He is also the gate of the sheepfold. All who enter through him will "have life and have it more abundantly." Our relationship with Jesus allows us a place of refuge, a place where we will always find nourishment and safety. Jesus has called us by name, so we are able then to recognize his voice.

What does that mean in terms of our daily living? Jesus is the Good Shepherd who knows us by name, and he wants us to know him in the same way that he knows his Father, and his Father knows him. He knows and loves us intimately, and he gives us the grace to know and love him in the same way.

We learn to do this by taking the time each day to listen to his voice. He speaks to us in the Scriptures, in our worship, in our personal prayer, and in the people and events that are part of our daily lives. St. Francis de Sales calls this process learning to let Jesus live in us. As we let ourselves be led by the voice of Jesus,

Jesus lives in us more and more - and the new life that he shares with us becomes the source from which we live each day. The power that flows from his death and rising transforms our self-centeredness into out-reaching love for one another. More and more, we become the love of God incarnated in our world.

Because we hear Jesus' voice, we are able to be more patient in our suffering. We are able to look at Jesus' own experience of suffering and learn from him how to accept our own. He left us an example. He trusted in his Father's love for him and knew that his Father was with him no matter what he was doing. He listened for his Father's voice and found refuge in his love.

In the sacrament of Baptism, Jesus called us by name and made us part of his flock. What a wonderful gift we have been given in our baptism! May we learn to take hold of that gift each day and nurture its growth through prayer and generous love. Let us take joy in the fact that Jesus is leading us to abundance of life with him an abundance that will be complete in eternity.

Our Parish Heritage 2023

Celebrating the Anniversary Year of St. Mary's (1873), Our Lady Star of the Sea (1878) and St. Agnes (1883)

It was 150 years ago that Bishop Michael Corrigan of the Diocese of Newark established St. Mary's Church in Cape May as a parish and appointed Father Theophilus J. Degan as the first pastor.

Father Degan was born in Neymegan, Holland on August 19, 1830. He entered the Capuchin Franciscan community and was ordained a priest in 1857. Father Degan would minister in Holland, Belgium and Liverpool, England. In 1871, after receiving permission to leave the Capuchin order, Father Degan became affiliated with the Diocese of Newark.

Father Degan, was not only the first pastor of St. Mary's Church, but also the first pastor of Our Lady Star of the Sea. On January 26, 1878, a Certificate of Incorporation was issued in the city of Cape May recognizing the Catholic parish as the Church of Our Lady Star of the Sea.

Listed on the certificate of Incorporation are Michael Augustine Corrigan, the Bishop of Newark, who in 1880 would become the Archbishop of New York, Father Theophilus Degan, pastor, and two lay trustees of the parish, Francis J. Green and John Maguire.

It is the year 1878 that the parish has traditionally celebrated as its anniversary year. Two wonderful commemorative books were published in 1978 and 2003 marking the 100th and 125th anniversaries. In 2028, we will celebrate the 150th anniversary of the parish of Our Lady Star of the Sea.

Sadly, the year 1878 was marked also by a great tragedy. On November 9, 1878, a fire broke out at the Ocean House on Perry Street across from Congress Hall. While there was no loss of life, strong winds spread the fire throughout the city and most of the town was leveled.

The church and the rectory were spared from the devasting fire and in November, 1878, land was purchased on the west side of Washington Street. The former St. Mary's Church was dismantled and moved to the present site of the Church of Our Lady Star of the Sea. St. Agnes Church in Cape May Point is a replica of St. Mary's Church.

In 1887, Father Degan opened a convent and the Sisters of Mercy came to staff a parish school. The Sisters of Mercy blessed the parish with their ministry at the school from 1887 until 1912. In 1920 the school would reopen staffed by the Sisters of Saint Joseph.

Father Degan faithfully served as pastor of St. Mary's and of Our Lady Star of the Sea from 1873 until his death on October 31, 1900. He was succeeded by Father Dennis S. Kelly under whose pastorate the construction of the beautiful church of Our Lady Star of the Sea was begun in 1911.





While you may have chosen to be cremated, remember to choose your final resting place. Although the Church earnestly recommends the pious custom of burying the bodies of the dead be observed, it does not however, forbid cremation unless it has been chosen for reasons which are contrary to Christian teaching. Cremated remains are the body of the deceased in a changed form. We should honor them as we honor the body. They must be reverently buried or entombed in a place reserved for the burial of the dead.
